FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time: One of the questions put to religious teachers in Jesus's time concerned the number of person (many or few?) who will be saved, that is, those who will share in the great banquet of God's kingdom. In today's gospel Jesus is asked the question, 'Lord, will those who are saved be few?' Jesus does not answer that question. Instead, he issues a series of sayings and parables that emphasised the difficulty involved in entering God's Kingdom and he stresses the need for constant fidelity and vigilance throughout our lives. Thus, Jesus reminds us that even though God wants all of us to be saved, we all need to work at it. Entry into God's Kingdom is not automatically granted, and so we cannot presume on God's mercy and do nothing by way of response to God's invitation. Will only a few persons be saved? The answer to that question remains hidden with God. The two great attributes of God in the Bible are justice and mercy. Which will prevail at the last judgement depends on God. Today's excerpt from Luke 13 affirms that God wants all persons to enjoy eternal life with him. And it reminds us that entry into God's Kingdom is not automatic. Rather, it requires faith in God, firmness of purpose and sharpness of focus and appropriate actions and constant vigilance. While the invitation to God's banquet is extended to all, we have to act upon it. How many will be saved in the end is a decision that rests with God.

SERVICES OF WORD AND COMMUNION IN THE ABSENCE OF A PRIEST OR DEACON: There will be a training session for parishioners who have expressed an interest in working as part of a team to lead these services when they are required. The same session will be held in each parish and parishioners can attend whichever date is more convenient: Tuesday 26th August at St Catherine's and Monday 22nd September* at St Agnes (after 9.15am Mass). WIRRAL COASTAL WALK FOR THE SVP: The magnificent sum of £1,112.20 was raised for the sponsored walk undertaken in July. £894 of this was gift-aided which will increase the total to £1,335.70. On behalf of all those who will directly benefit from the extra help this money will provide, the SVP would like to thank parishioners for responding so generously to their appeal.

CAFOD'S RESPONSE IN GAZA: Your donations to Gaza since the start of the conflict have been a vital lifeline. Right now, CAFOD's partner, Caritas Jerusalem, is delivering essential medical treatment to displaced people and providing medicines to treat chronic illnesses. They have helped 1,400 households with cash to buy supplies in the last month and are currently feeding 2,000 people with new stocks of flour and rice.
